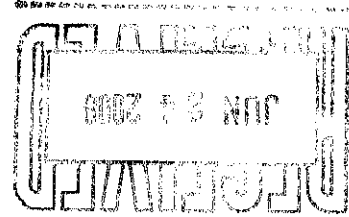

PETITION FOR RELIEF

RE: Request to Investigate Government and Judicial Misconduct: i.e., **GOOD vs. EVIL**
See Commonwealth of PA Attorney General, et al v. Claudia A. Montelione et al
Civil Actions Case No. **2008-CV-00875-EQ** and **757 CD 2008** et al.

Dear Governor Edward G. Rendell:

If it is true that the Constitution of the United States is a **GOOD** document, which we the people may assume because our rights and privileges as individuals are secured under that document, and because the Oath of Office as sworn to by public officers in this Commonwealth requires allegiance to and support of that Constitution, then it follows *a priori* that failure to support and obey that Constitution is **EVIL**.

"Law and court procedures that are "fair on their faces" but administered "with an evil eye or a heavy hand" was discriminatory and violates the equal protection clause of the Fourteenth Amendment." Yick Wo v. Hopkins, 118 US 356 (1886).

Executive Branch Duty

Pennsylvania's Governor has a duty to obey and support the Constitutions of this Nation and this Commonwealth under Article VI, Section 3 of the Constitution of Pennsylvania.

Petitioner's Demand

The undersigned citizen, Friend of the Commonwealth, herewith petitions the Government of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and specifically the Office of Governor of this Commonwealth to exercise the plenary powers of that office to preserve and protect the constitutional rights of the citizens of this Commonwealth, and specifically to conduct an investigation of the Executive and Judicial branches of this government to determine whether Thomas W. Corbett, Jr., alleging to serve as Attorney General of this Commonwealth conspired with the Dauphin County Court of Common Pleas, judge Lawrence F. Clark, et al, to deprive Claudia A. Montelione of her rights under the constitutions of this Nation and this Commonwealth.

Further, as a citizen/resident of this Commonwealth, I herewith petition for a redress of grievances as of right as secured by the U.S. Constitution, Amendment I. The grievance forwarded to you, as Governor of this Commonwealth, arises from the egregious tyrannical conduct of courts of law within this Commonwealth; conduct which when examined as whole cloth reveals a systemic failure to support and obey the Constitution of the United States; to respect and administer cases in accordance with Pennsylvania Rules of Court; to administer law with an evil eye and a heavy hand in a most oppressive and tyrannical manner, including the

incarceration of a citizen who was not served with a complaint, and of whom this government, by and through the Office of Attorney General demanded an illegal search and seizure of property and other materials in clear violation of **Article I, Section 8** of the Constitution of Pennsylvania.

Claudia A. Montelione was apprehended in Lackawanna County under a warrant issued in Dauphin County without evidence to support jurisdiction of the court in Dauphin County. Dauphin County acted without jurisdiction, rendering any action by the court to be a NULLITY, *void ab initio*. The warrant for Ms. Montelione's arrest is a VOID Order. She has been incarcerated since on or before March 29, 2008. Initially, she was denied visitation by even her family members. She is essentially a "political prisoner" held without charges and without the opportunity to post bail.

It is not unreasonable to presume that the Office of Attorney General acted in collusion with the courts, judge Clark et al, and on behalf of a foreign corporation to harass, oppress, intimidate, tyrannize and terrorize Claudia A. Montelione. Ms. Montelione appeared in Dauphin County as a special appearance to challenge the jurisdiction of the court. The court proceeded to strip Ms. Montelione of the assistance of counsel as required and provided under Pennsylvania common law. Judge Clark ordered Ms. Montelione to OBEY the unlawful demand for a search and seizure of her personal and business property as unlawfully submitted [in violation of Pa Rules of Court] by the agents of the Attorney General.

The errors perpetrated by the court and the Office of Attorney General, by and through the Bureau of Consumer Protection, cannot be construed as innocent errors. A multi-national foreign corporation, Halliburton, by an attorney for its Texas subsidiary, threatened Ms. Montelione with legal action despite the absence of any commercial contract between the parties. Ms. Montelione was then subjected to an "investigation" by the [Pennsylvania] Bureau of Consumer Protection despite the absence of any consumer complaint being filed against her. Further, The Secretary of State undertook an action to remove from Ms. Montelione her "commission" as a Notary Public in this Commonwealth. Docket No. 0046-99-07; File NO. 05-99-10298.

The timing of the actions by the Attorney General and the Secretary of State leads reasonably minded persons to conclude that both "executive" offices were acting in collusion and in conformance with the demands of the foreign corporation. The attorney for the Secretary of State stated at the SHOW CAUSE hearing to review her commission that the State intended to make an example of her.

Ms. Montelione remains in prison in Dauphin County, without bail, and without any bona fide complaint brought against her or her business operations. It is incumbent upon your office and in accordance with your Oath of Office to investigate the administration of the case against Claudia A. Montelione for the purpose of arranging for her immediate release from prison. She is being held as a "political prisoner" being DENIED the assistance of counsel, and the right to post "bail" until a trial can be scheduled. While imprisoned, Ms. Montelione is being deprived of a "full and fair opportunity" to prepare her defense against the Commonwealth.

Your investigation must review whether Pennsylvania Rules of Court have been violated or otherwise disregarded for the Dauphin County court to "assume" jurisdiction where none exists. Further, your investigation must review whether or not Thomas W. Corbett, Jr. has failed to meet the qualifications for the Office of Attorney General as prescribed in Article IV, Section 5 of the Constitution of Pennsylvania.

This matter is an egregious travesty of justice perpetrated upon a law-abiding citizen by a tyrannical government. The government's actions are malicious and intentional. Your office has a duty to investigate and to resolve the issues brought forward in all documents filed in this matter and those noted herein.

Public officers engaged in a conspiracy [with others] to deprive Claudia A. Montelione [and others] of her civil rights and personal liberty contrary to 42 U.S.C. § 1985, 18 U.S.C. §§ 241 and 242, 18 Pa.C.S. § 903 and other laws. These are rights secured under the Constitutions and laws of the United States and this Commonwealth.

The criminal conspiracy of public officers renders them as being ethically, morally and professionally bankrupt. Each of them should be removed from public office. Each of them should be subjected to professional discipline, including disbarment, and criminal prosecution.

Thank you for your **prompt** attention and positive actions in response to these grievances. Ms. Montelione deserves to be released from prison **immediately**.

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

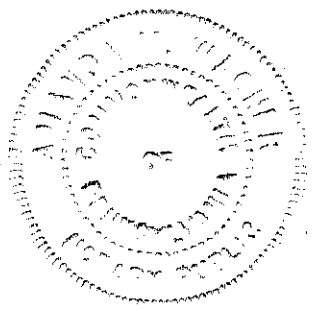


Dear Mr. Wrona:
